Yann Passabet-Labiste was born in France. He began studying violin at the age of four and at four-and-a-half years old was already performing Mozart's Variations of "Ah, vous dirais-je, Maman". From the age of eight, he began making public appearances.



Some years later, he had the opportunity to study with renowned violinists and teachers such as Maurice Moulin, Gérard Poulet, Jean-Marc Phillips-Varjabedian and Liliane Béguin-Rossi. In 1998, Yann Passabet-Labiste was selected by Radio France from over 100 musicians to perform a broadcast concert in the 'Salon Musicora'. At the time, he was only 18 years old. The young violinist decided to go to the Superior Conservatory of Geneva in Switzerland to perfect his art under the guidance of the famous maestro Jean-Pierre Wallez. He achieved his master's degree in just a year. In addition to his violin lessons, he received a complete formation: trio with piano, strings quartet, music analysis, baroque and contemporary music. His three year cursus was crowned by the highest recognition: first prize of virtuosity given unanimously and with special distinctions.

It was in 2005 that Yann Passabet-Labiste's international career got underway. He began his travels throughout Europe performing at the Wigmore and Royal Albert halls in London during the BBC Proms. His success brought him to a concert tour in Japan, where he performed concerts for a month with the cellist Yo-Yo Ma. For two consecutive years (2015 and 2016) in conjunction with his participation in

international competitions, the violinist was invited to perform with the Japanese Virtuoso at prestigious venues such as Tokyo Bunka Kaikan, Hyogo Performing Arts Center and Yokkaichi City Cultural Center. In 2018, as a result of his rich and vast experience, Yann Passabet-Labiste was chosen to occupy the seat of 2nd violin leader in the Würtembergisches Kammerorchester Heilbronn in Germany. Besides his soloist and chamber music career, from the age of 25 Yann has occupied the violin solo position in many orchestras in France as well as in Switzerland. He was also a member of the Tonhalle Orchestra of Zürich for a period of four years.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

From childhood, Yann Passabet-Labiste demonstrated his immense capability in national and international competitions.

At the age of 14, he was gold medalist unanimously and with the felicitations of the jury at the National School of Ville d'Avray. During the next few years he won the first prize of Excellency, the first prize City of Paris and the first prize in master's degree. In 2001, under the guidance of the famous maestro Jean-Pierre Wallez, he was awarded first prize of virtuosity. He was also awarded first prize of chamber music (trio and quartet) with special mention under the guidance of Maestro Gabor Takacs-Nagy (1st violin of the Takacs quartet).

At the age of 23, he became laureate at the 36th Tibor Varga international violin competition. He was also the 2nd and 3rd prize winner in category 'Solo' and

'Chamber Music' at the Grand Prize Virtuoso international competition in the UK. Yann Passabet-Labiste was 1st Grand Prize winner in 2 categories: category 'soloist with orchestra' and category 'virtuosity' at the 11th and 12th Concorso Internationale Di Esecuzione Musicale "Premio Citta' Di Padova" in Italy.

Most recently, Yann was the 2017 1st prize winner at the Grand Prix d'Europe in Paris. »

The famous violinist pedagogue Eduard Schmieder, in describing the uniqueness of Yann's playing, likened it to a very rare combination of drama and poetry.
